Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

In the midst of Respect Life Month and its emphasis on the critical moral issues relating to our duty to cherish every human life from conception to natural death, we are confronted today with one of the other great moral challenges. It is the matter of wealth, possessions and money and the challenge earthly goods can pose to our relationship to God.

The issue is presented to us in the encounter between Jesus and the rich man who asks him what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus starts with a solid Jewish answer and simply lays before him the second table of the Law, those commandments that deal with our relationship to our neighbor. The man is pious and sincere in saying that he has kept them faithfully. That's an excellent start, but the Kingdom Jesus proclaims requires a more radical devotion. Such devotion proves to be a bridge too far for the man because he cannot imagine giving up his possessions.

All of us are confronted with the call to view the goods and wealth with which God has endowed us as temporary loans from God and to use them without undue attachment, with generosity, and in freedom from greed and covetousness. This requires wisdom and prudence as the Old Testament reading reminds us. God gives us gifts through our baptism. To follow Christ is to use the gifts he gives us so that nothing looms larger in our lives than the Kingdom of God which he proclaimed.

On the personal front, as some of you know, I was able to celebrate Mass from the wheelchair at the 11:00 AM at the Cathedral last week. So I hope to celebrate the Mass with you from time to time in the coming weeks. I am able to stand for a considerable time and am more and more able to walk holding up the walker for safety but not relying on it. The healing from the injury is slow but noticeable. On the other front, I seem to be responding as I should to the chemotherapy, and at least one of my siblings is a match for eventual stem cell therapy.

I want to thank you for your prayers, cards, holy hours and masses. Christa and I are very much sustained by your love and kindness.
