Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

Today's Gospel tells the story of Jesus' walking on the Sea of Galilee and of Peter's failed attempt to walk across the water to meet him. Jesus describes him as 'of little faith' and then stretches out his arm to save him as he begins to sink.

Peter may not have shown much faith in this story, but he did show some sense. Realizing that he was about to be literally in over his head, he reached for the nearest assistance, and that of course was Jesus himself. In fact, in reaching out Peter is exercising a small but real faith. The storm and the waves quickly reveal his weakness and limitations and so he grabs the hand of Jesus.

We likewise are often people of little faith, but faith grows in part from recognizing our limitations. A sermon I heard many years ago contained the line, "We've got too many people trying to walk on water without having the ability to do so." But if we recognize that we can't walk on water, literally or figuratively, we are on our way to a stronger faith. The humble recognition of human limitations is an important part of growing in faith. We see this humble recognition in Peter's desperate grasp of Christ's hand, and thus today's Gospel guides us to a stronger faith.

The Gospel for today's Latin Mass, the story of the Pharisee and the publican, gives another view of the humility that lies at the heart of true faith. The Pharisee thinks that in the eyes of God he can walk on water because of his external virtues, but he can't and his boast holds no water with God. It is the outcast tax collector who simply begs for mercy who goes to his home justified. Like Peter he reaches out in his weakness rather than imagining himself stronger and better than he is.

In another passage Jesus compares faith to a mustard seed; it grows from very small beginnings. As we integrate into our lives a deeper realization of our weakness and our need, the seed of faith can sprout and grow.
