Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

July 1 on the pre-Vatican II calendar is the Feast of Precious Blood of Christ and was celebrated as such at last Sunday's Latin Mass. This feast led to dedicating the month of July devotionally to the Precious Blood of Christ. The dedication of different months to different mysteries of salvation has fallen away in practice to some extent but continues in dedicating May to Mary, October to the rosary, and November to the faithful departed. It is good for us to remember that older practice and to reflect this month on the blood of Christ. Shed for our salvation, the outpouring of the blood of Christ is in reality and symbol the ultimate evidence of God's love for us.

Such an emphasis may offend certain modern sensibilities. As coarse as modern culture is, we live far from the shedding of blood—including that necessary in food preparation. (And it cannot be avoided by being vegetarian or vegan. Animals are killed and injured and habitat destroyed in all agriculture.) Sacrifice sustains life; sacrifice opens the way to eternal life. Thus the blood of Christ becomes for us the most precious sign of mercy and eternal life.

Because the Son of God shed his blood for the life of the world, it is necessary for us to share the news of the love of God. This weekend Bishop John Ricard, retired bishop of Tallahassee-Pensacola, will be here as a mission speaker. He will preach and preside at all three masses at the Cathedral and at the 5:00 PM Mass at St. Patrick's. There will be a second collection for the ministries of the Josephite order of which he is a member and which has done much valuable ministry among African-Americans. The order served St. Joseph's, French St., for a long time, and the late Deacon Robert Levesque was in the community for several years.

Please give generously and thus help to spread the message of the saving blood of Christ.
