**PRAY THE ROSARY DAILY**

Dear Members and Friends . . .

There is in Anglo-American Protestantism a strong theme of building the new Jerusalem. William Blake's early 19<sup>th</sup> century poem, often sung as a hymn in England, concludes: "I will not cease from mental fight, nor shall my sword sleep in my hand, till we have built Jerusalem in England's green and pleasant land." Two centuries earlier the Puritan settlers in New England spoke of creating a city set on a hill, an image from Jesus' preaching that references the lofty city of Jerusalem. The Masonic Enlightenment aspects of our revolutionary era led to the words on the great seal of the U.S.: "Fortune smiles on a new order of the ages."

The biblical roots of this imagery are very clear, for today we hear from the prophet Isaiah who envisions a new Jerusalem receiving her children and nourishing them.

For Isaiah, however, the new Jerusalem is not something we build. It is the gift of God. It is his promise that will come to fulfillment in his own time. So while the Bible is the source of our national ideals, it is not necessarily in agreement with them.

Still there is an important correlation. America at its best aspires to the good, to be a community that is exemplary in liberty and justice. America at its best is inspired by the biblical image of a new Jerusalem. America at its best has been a great experiment in ordered liberty and self-government. Unlike most other nations America is not a nation created by geography and ethnicity (blood and soil) but by an idea that all men are equal and endowed by their creator with unalienable rights.

As Christian Americans we celebrate the American experiment. As Catholics we recognize a much greater and more diverse reality, the One Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, which gathers people from every race and tongue and anticipates the new and heavenly Jerusalem. But as Catholics we also recognize and support the great historical exception that is the American experiment.
