**Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:**

There is a change coming. After discussion with Michael Davidson, the Cathedral director of music, and Terry Boyer, the organist at St. Mary's and St. Patrick's, I have placed orders for the **Book of Sacred Liturgy**. It is a hardbound worship resource and will replace the soft bound *Breaking Bread* that we have to replace each year.

Over the coming weeks I will explain more fully the reasons, but I want to begin by telling you a little about the book. First and foremost, you should know that the layout is roughly similar to breaking bread. The front section has the text of the Mass including all the Eucharist Prayers. And it has the readings for Sundays (all three years of the cycle) and for the major Feasts and Solemnities. It also includes rites for Confirmation, Baptism, etc.

The hymnal section is in the back and numbers about 300 hymns. The collection is superb, and I will say more on this later. The best of traditional Catholic and Protestant hymnody is represented along with some fine new compositions and a small collection the best of the 'seventies' style. There is a decent amount also of Latin chant and hymns.

The **Book of Sacred Liturgy** offers several musical settings of the Mass, but we will buy a small number of copies of *Breaking Bread* in order to secure copyright permission to use liturgical music printed there. We will probably start the transition in the fall and move to exclusive use of the new resource in Advent.

I believe the transition will not be too difficult and quickly come to be a happy one. At \$20 each within four or five years the cost of the new books will equal what we would have spent on throw away materials. I will also be inviting you to subscribe to purchase copies as memorials or to honor someone. Liturgically (and financially) this should work well for us, and I will continue the explanation over the coming weeks.
