**Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:**

King David's offense, as described in today's first reading, was rank. He had stolen the wife of his officer Uriah the Hittite and then arranged for him to be killed in battle. He was guilty of both adultery and murder. The Gospel does not identify the sins of the woman who disrupts a nice dinner party anointing Jesus' feet with her tears and with expensive oil, kissing them and wiping them with her hair. Her sin is most likely the sin of the powerless, as David's sin was that of the powerful. Both were nonetheless sins, damaging and degrading to all involved.

Now, the devil is sneaky, and so for us there lurks a treacherous and deceptive temptation. You see, we assume that we're not as bad as David and the sinful woman. That is probably true! But sin is not just a matter of murder and adultery.

David's sin started long before he committed adultery and murder. It started with lust of the eye and the heart. Before that it had roots in his dissatisfaction, his power, and his boredom. Sin is not just the eruption of wicked acts. It starts with lack of faith and trust in God that makes us dissatisfied with the blessings we have received. It starts with the failure to understand that God's grace is sufficient. There is sin in all of that.

We can be grateful that we have not sinned in the way that David did, but that should not make us complacent. We are called to examine our consciences for the small infidelities and offenses that separate us from God by slow and imperceptible degrees. What the Church has traditionally called venial sins are still real sins. The little sins of heart and mind can damage a soul, just as David's great crimes did.

So while we may not sin on David's scale—for which God be praised! - We need to repent as fervently as he did. Only thus do we avoid the slow slippage away from faith, hope and love that are such a danger in our time.
