Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

I want to use my bulletin letter this week to share some news.

First, there is good news about our response to the Annual Catholic Appeal. Every parish has exceeded its target. This year was the first year to raise the targets since the beginning of the Capital Campaign in 2013, but we still did well. Thank you for your generous involvement. Here are the results:

The Cathedral's target was \$30,000. The pledged amount was \$31,281; 55 out of 127 households pledged, a total of 43%.

St. Mary's target was \$10,000. The pledged amount was \$10,348; 25 out of 56 households pledged, a total of 45%.

St. Patrick's target was \$26,000. The pledged amount was \$31,759; 75 out of 121 households (121 may be a little low, however) pledged, or 62%, for the highest rate in the diocese.

Our small parishes play an important role in the community and the diocese, and in this area we play a leadership role. Our stewardship of our material blessings is a critical part of our discipleship.

The **second** thing I want to note is that the Fortnight for Freedom begins on June 21. Freedom of religion is under assault in many facets of our culture and politics. The recent victory of the Little Sisters of the Poor and their fellow plaintiffs against the contraceptive mandate is important, but it is one battle in a long war. Pray and work for increased respect for the Bill of Rights. The Fortnight will conclude with a 9:00 AM Mass at the Cathedral on July 4, celebrated by Bishop Malooly.

Third, while we enter today into the Sundays of Ordinary Time, June is rich with Feasts and Solemnities and you will enrich your faith and prayer by observing them in private prayer and attending Mass on those days.

Friday was the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart and Saturday the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Friday, June 24, is the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, and Wednesday, June 29, is the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, the two pillars of the Church and of the Church of Rome.

Stewardship, citizenship and worship—all are critical for the life of faith and the health of the Church.
