PRAY THE ROSARY DAILY!

Dear Members and Friends,

When Jesus warns us in today's Gospel that following him will be difficult, he is calling us to radical discipleship. 'Radical' is not just a political term. It comes from the Latin word *radix* which means *root*. Our faith is to go all the way down to the roots of our being.

The Christian faith is not a matter of a few religious practices nor of getting a few ideas right. It is a matter of living with and for Jesus Christ, and that will mean bearing the cross as he did.

When Christian disciples truly take up their cross and follow him, they invariably become a threat to the principalities and powers of the present age. We remind them that they are not God, and this is very annoying.

In our own country the principalities and powers are more and more at odds with Christianity, especially to the more orthodox expressions of it, namely the Catholic Church and the Evangelicals. Corporate power often promotes values deeply at odds with ours. The government is increasingly intolerant of the distinctiveness and contrary values of religious people, as it promotes ever greater uniformity. Secularist elites sneer, unaware of the shallowness of their own philosophy and understanding. The media take pride in their freedom from 'Islamophobia' while turning their guns on non-violent Christian dissent from the sexual revolution.

Then there is the simple vulgar contempt for those who pursue righteousness, for no one after all should be a 'holier roller' or strive to be 'holier than thou.'

But it is for these reasons that we seek to follow the Lord faithfully, to share the rejection he experienced. We see in the mercy of God and in the call to holiness something far more hopeful than the hedonism and materialism of our time. We see in Christ a wisdom far deeper than the scoffing of the opponents of Christ and his Church. We see the promise of the Kingdom of God and drink at the well of God's mercy even now. We know that we are valued not just as consumers or cogs in a wheel. We are valued by God who alone has given us an immortal destiny.
