Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

Today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity has its roots in last Sunday's celebration of Pentecost. Originally this day was the octave (eighth-day) celebration of Pentecost, concluding a week-long observance. During the early part of the second millennium the day evolved into a celebration of the Trinity. Pentecost's emphasis on the work of the Holy Spirit encouraged the development of a day of reflection on the fullness of God, his triune nature.

And so that is what we do on this day; we pause to reflect on who God is—the eternal community of love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All of our efforts to understand and define God necessarily fall short of the mystery. But that does not mean that they are pointless hair-splitting, as so many skeptics have charged throughout the centuries.

The Church cannot avoid reflecting on the Holy Trinity because that is how God has made himself known. Therefore, that is who God is. The Father sends the Son into the world, and the Holy Spirit continues the mission of the Son in the Church and less obviously also in the world.

The earliest Christians acknowledged Jesus as Lord and God. The fundamental sacrament—Baptism—is into the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. We may address the Father, the Son or the Holy Spirit in prayer. To put it simply, it is not possible to do these things, to be Christian, without reflecting on the doctrine of the Trinity. The God who reveals himself in the Scriptures, in the life of Israel and in the life of the Church is the Holy Trinity. The doctrines decreed by the ancient councils and embodied in the Nicene Creed are necessary to clarify and preserve fundamental truths about God.

And so the Church celebrates this day as we look back on the mysteries of Christmas, Easter and Pentecost, for in those feasts and in the whole story of salvation it is the triune God who is at work.
