This weekend we begin using **The Book of Sacred Liturgy**. As in Breaking Bread the hymns are in the back section. The text of the Mass begins at page 8 in the front of the book; however, at sung Masses we will continue to use familiar musical settings. Readings and the entrance and communion antiphons for all the three years of the lectionary cycle are in the middle section of the book. This year is 'Year C' and today's readings for the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time are at page 617. Note that there are ribbons to mark the pages.

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

The days are shorter and the weather grows chilly. We return to Standard Time next week (so don't forget to turn your clocks back!). November is upon us. For much of the world around us that means getting ready for the Yuletide with a pause at Thanksgiving along the way.

Not so for us Catholics. **November is the month when we focus upon our particular obligation to pray for the dead, to remember them in the liturgy and in our private prayer.** It is a central teaching of the faith that we live in communion with the whole baptized people of God—on earth in the Church militant, in purgatory in the Church suffering, and in heaven in the Church triumphant. We assist with our prayers those who have gone before us and they in turn assist us, for the mystery of salvation is the mystery of the Church, of the communion of saints.

So do not neglect this time; prayer for the living and the dead is the last of the spiritual works of mercy. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy make a special effort to do so.

The theme of November is sounded by All Saints Day on Tuesday, November 1, and All Souls Day on Wednesday, November 2. **All Saints Day** is a Holy Day of Obligation. Do not neglect it—the schedule of Masses is elsewhere in the bulletin. **All Souls Day** is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but we should feel an obligation to pray, attend Mass, and visit the graves of our loved ones on that day.

This month is marked also by **Veterans Day**, and that fits into the Catholic observance of this month with a kind of bitter irony. Veterans Day when I was a boy was 'Armistice Day,' which recalled the end of the particular insanity that was World War 1, when the supposedly Christian nations of Europe slaughtered each other to little purpose and triggered the despair and further evils that marked the last century and still afflict us. Appropriately, we will take up the triennial collection for the Archdiocese for the Military next week. Please give generously, as the forces of our nation continue to stand by in a new era of turmoil.

In the midst of life we are in death. And so we hold up in prayer those who have gone before us.
