### SUPPORT ST. VINCENT DEPAUL SOC.

**Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:**

This is the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. We are moving rapidly through the liturgical year. But Sunday is also October 7, and if it were a weekday, it would be the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. It is that Feast that is the source of the special connection of this month with the rosary, ever since Pope St. Pius V called upon the Christians of Europe to pray the rosary for the defeat of the Turkish fleet poised to invade the heart of Europe. This Islamic invasion was turned back when the Christians' fleet prevailed on this day in 1571 off the west coast of Greece.

Pope Francis has invited "all the faithful, of all the world, to pray the Holy Rosary every day, during the entire Marian month of October, and thus to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael the Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other."

Throughout the United States today many Catholics will be praying the rosary for the nation. All the signs are that the nation and the Church are profoundly in need of prayer, and I urge you to join our fellow believers in reciting the rosary especially on this day.

The rosary has long been encouraged by the Church as a pious family practice, and today's readings help us to discern the importance of that, for they hold before us the value and divine origin of marriage and the family. The reading from Genesis tells the story of the creation of the woman from the rib of the man and reminds us of the beauty of our creation as male and female. In the midst of the current madness about transgenderism God is reminding us that there are two sexes and for a good purpose. The drugging and mutilating of children who are confused about their gender is not legitimate medicine; it is madness. Of that we are reminded also in the Gospel where Jesus embraces the children.

The rage of our politics, the assaults on marriage and family, the declining birthrate, and corruption in the church—for these and other reasons you have plenty of reason to pray the rosary this October.
