Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

We are now fully in Ordinary Time. The season begins immediately after Pentecost—although that transition is now softened by the new Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, on the Monday following Pentecost. Still, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi on the two Sundays following Pentecost can make it seem like the festival portion of the church year was continuing.

Today we are definitely back in green vestments and working our way once more through the Gospel of Year B, the Gospel of Mark. Mark's Gospel is fast-moving and intense and rapidly sets up the conflict between Jesus and the leaders of his people. We see that already in today's Gospel from the third chapter. The scribes accuse him of being possessed, and even his relatives are worried about him.

What exactly had he done to arouse this hostility and concern? He has gathered crowds; he has generated excitement about the possibility of the Kingdom of God breaking in. He has done this not by demagoguery but by healings, casting out demons, preaching and announcing the forgiveness of sins. Up to this point Mark has merely laid out for us a summary of his ministry in Galilee. Jesus is suspect because he is rocking the boat.

He is rocking the boat in the process of revealing the coming Kingdom of God by doing good. No one but the demons is harmed by his actions. We see in the resistance to Jesus that all-too-human tendency to be suspicious of the good, when it comes in a form we did not desire or expect. To be sure, there is plain old fear of change, but mostly what we see today is a form of hostility toward anyone whose goodness and energy stand out and accuse the rest of us.

There is a diabolical aspect to the resistance Jesus encounters, the subtle ugliness of envy and disdain and hostility toward the urgency he brings to his prophetic ministry. Mostly, we prefer to go unchallenged, to take it easy, and to let things ride. But Jesus upsets the inertia of the people of his own day, and he upsets ours as well—for our own good!
