Dear Members and Friends of St. Mary's, St. Patrick's and St. Peter's Cathedral:

In today's Old testament reading, Moses teaches the people of Israel their great confession of faith, the Shema: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength."

This is of course a confession of the Christian Church as well. As we say in the creed, we believe in one God. Our confession of the Trinity does not deny the oneness of God.

Jesus in today's Gospel responds to a scribe's query about his teaching by reciting the Shema and adding that we should love our neighbors as ourselves. The scribe approves and then Jesus takes the initiative and addresses him with the striking words, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God." As ever he speaks with authority. I'm sure the scribe was taken by surprise.

And we should listen. To confess and love the true God and to love our neighbors as ourselves is at the heart of the faith. In this month dedicated to the last things—heaven, hell, death and judgment—we do well to remember these basics laid before us today. November's emphasis is not designed to terrify us but to remind us ever to be ready for the Lord's call by a life of faith in God, fidelity to the Church, and good works. If we live thus, we will like the scribe be not far from the Kingdom of God.

On the personal front there is not a lot new. I am making progress in therapy and can walk further and stand longer. Week by week I can do more. I have finished the second round of chemo and need to wait a while to learn the impact.
